## Value Added Courses

MES GCC has introduced divergent Value-added and Add-on Courses to enhance value addition to the curriculum and also to impart the imperative qualities to render the students employable.

### **Diploma in Banking and Finance (DB & F) (60 hrs)**

This course of the Indian Institute of Banking and Finance (IIBF), an affiliate of the RBI is conducted by JSBL Solutions Pvt. Ltd. The course provides direct openings to the students in clerical grade posts in different banks.

### **Logistics, Supply Chain and Operations (30 hrs)**

This course is a joint initiative of the College with Indian Institute of Materials Management (IIMM). It covers the basic concepts of supply chain with focus on warehousing, inventory management, transportation, etc.

### **Digital Marketing (30 hrs)**

This course is conducted in association with Arena Multimedia and introduces the concepts of digital marketing and search engine optimization (SEO) techniques. It also covers the concepts of organic and regular traffic, digital marketing plans and prepares the students for the Google Certification Program.

### **International Trade (30 hrs)**

In view of the current International Business Environment, the International Trade course had been designed and was conducted in association with Marhatta Chamber of Commerce, Industries and Agriculture (MCCIA).

### **Python Technology (20 hrs)**

Python Technology course is designed to provide a basic hands-on experience on Python programming. It is conducted in association with Seed Infotech. In this course, the students are introduced to Web programming language that is preferred by the employers in the current market scenario.

### **Goods and Services Tax (GST) (30 hrs)**

This course prepares the students with the newly implemented GST tax and its implementation from Tally ERP 9 Software. The course introduces various terminologies, compliance, preparing invoices, computing tax liability, upload and download various GST Returns, record various GST related transaction from Tally ERP 9, triangulated GST reports from Tally ERP 9, etc.

### **Soft Skills (40 hrs)**

This online certification course is conducted through video conferencing by Cognitive Exchange, Folsom, California, USA. It focuses on the speech reproduction techniques and



enhances the speaking skills. Apart from this course, the College conducts a 10 days' workshop in Soft Skills as prescribed by the University.

#### **Android Programming (15 hrs)**

In association with SEED InfoTech, the course focusses on developing applications on Android mobiles. The students can also learn the techniques of notifications, publishing the applications on Google Play, etc.

#### **Cyber Security (30 hrs)**

This course covers the concepts of confidentiality, ability and integrity in information assurance, during physical software, devices, policies and people. The course is designed to manage operating systems software, network services and security.

#### **Share Market Exposure (30 hrs)**

This course is conducted with the help of trainers from Bombay Stock Exchange (BSE) to give an overview of the working of the stock market, investment tactics, financial products and their working, portfolio and investment planning, etc. Mock stock sessions and simulations make the course interesting.

#### **Advanced MS Excel (24 hrs)**

The certificate course is designed to train the students with the advanced levels of MS Excel and conducted in association with Suyash Educom. The course features managing worksheets, data analysis, database management, preparing charts and pivot tables, handling macros, etc.

#### **Women Entrepreneurship Development (45 hrs)**

This course was designed with technical guidance from deAsra Foundation (under Persistent Systems Ltd.). Various expert sessions are conducted by professionals from deAsra. Field visits and experience sharing sessions provide necessary guidance and motivation to the women entrepreneurs.

#### **Agripreneurship (30 hrs)**

This course was launched this year and consisted of 7 modules that covered major agri-business areas like fruits & vegetables industry, export opportunities, organic farming, processing & packaging etc. Mrs. Manjari Desai, Director MCCI was invited for the inaugural session of the course and the sessions were conducted by well-known entrepreneurs and senior professionals from this field.

### **Add on Courses**

#### **Communication skills for managers (30 hrs)**

This is a compulsory Add-on course for first year students of BBA and BBA-IB course wherein they are given extra inputs for oral, written and non-verbal communication. Presentation skills, report writing, debates, group discussions, etc. are some of the topics of the course.

#### **Tally and Computer based Accounting (30 hrs)**

This is a compulsory Add-on course for BBA and BBA IB courses where the students learn to use the multi-functioning financial accounting, inventory management, taxation and payroll management software.

### Principles of programming and Algorithms (PPA) (30 hrs)

This compulsory Add-on course is conducted for FYBBA (CA) students as per the new syllabus. Here they learn about the concept of algorithms, writing algorithms, flowcharts, functions, arrays etc.

### Advance C (30 hrs)

This course is conducted as a compulsory Add-on course for FYBBA (CA) students as per the new syllabus. In this course, there are sessions on the concept of C language, arrays, functions, structures, unions, file handlings, etc.

There is continuous evaluation of students' performance through class tests, quizzes, tutorials, assignments and project work. Apart from evaluating the knowledge of the subject matter, the evaluation system also focuses on assessment of overall personality development of the students. The weak areas of each student are discussed and necessary guidance is provided for improvement. The progress record of each student is meticulously maintained.

#### **Examination pattern for BBA, BBA(IB) & BBA(CA) Courses**

Students' progress is evaluated in each subject, at the end of each semester. It comprises of internal assessment which is conducted by the College and External examination which is conducted by the Savitribai Phule Pune University. The performance in each subject is evaluated out of 100 marks. The 80:20 pattern prescribed by the University is followed for the exams of 2013 pattern for all the third year courses. 80 marks are assigned to the semester end examination conducted by the University. It is a written examination. 20 marks are assigned to the internal evaluation made by the College. The CBCS 2019 pattern has 70:30 pattern and has separate passing criteria for tutorials / practicals / internal / external marks.

#### **Standard of Passing and Award of Class**

Class is awarded on the aggregate marks obtained by a student as per rules of the University and on the basis of aggregate performance in the second and third year exams.

A candidate who has secured at least 40% of marks in each head of passing is declared as passed in the paper. Each theory, practical, internal & external examination is a separate head of passing.

#### **Notice**

- All the concerned students and parents should note "If any incidence of ragging comes to the notice of authorities, the concerned student shall be given a chance to explain and if his/her explanation is not found satisfactory, the College authorities would expel him/her from the college" as per the order of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, and the University letter Reference no. CA/2283 dtd.27th March 2008.
- Smoking and chewing of tobacco and similar products on the College Campus is strictly prohibited. Advertisement, promotion, sponsorship and sale of tobacco products is also prohibited on the College campus. Prohibition on smoking and chewing of Tobacco in public places - Tobacco Control Act, 2002



- 01 ➤ Students must attend lectures, practicals, tests and exams regularly and at appointed time. They should not remain absent without seeking the prior permission of the Principal. If 75% attendance is not satisfactory the student will not be allowed to appear for the final examination. In such cases the Committee decision will be final.
- 02 ➤ Student must take due care of property of the College. They are expected to maintain the entire area clean and tidy. Student should not form any 'group' or 'forum' on the campus without seeking the prior permission of the Principal in writing. They should not invite any person for organising a meeting without the prior permission of the authorities.
- 03 ➤ Smoking, drinking, spitting and consuming of drugs in the College campus is strictly prohibited.
- 04 ➤ Students should observe proper dressing sense in the College premises which is generally acceptable to the society at large. It should be decent and dignified.
- 05 ➤ On the loss of I-Card student should seek Duplicate card immediately from the College library by paying necessary fees and fine.
- 06 ➤ All the students must park their vehicles in cycle/scooter stand by paying the necessary charges. Facility of four wheeler parking for students and visitors is not available on the campus.
- 07 ➤ Authorities have full right to modify the rules whenever necessary and following of such modified rules is obligatory for the students. In case of any dispute Principal's decision will be final.
- 08 ➤ The College will take stern steps against the students in case of undisciplined behavior, disobeying of rules and orders. In such case Principal's decision will be final.
- 09 ➤ Students should note that College authorities will not allow annual social gathering or celebration of rose day, traditional day or any other similar events on the College campus.
- 10 ➤ It is expected that all the College students should observe proper manners & discipline inside & outside the College premises.
- 11 ➤ Students should be meticulous about filling the examination and eligibility forms on or before the stipulated date declared. In absence of filling these forms, a student will be solely held responsible and will have to bear the consequences.
- 12 ➤ Those who want to apply for various free ships & scholarships must apply in the prescribed time limit. In case of misbehaviour, a student is likely to be punished or debarred from appearing the University examination.



### Procedure for Domestic Students

1. All the Indian students are required to follow the admission procedure of the College.
2. For the BBA / BBA-IB / BBA-CA courses, the students have to register for the admission through the College website.
3. All the admissions will be given as per the University rules.

### Procedure for NRI students and International Students :

The admissions of all international & NRI students of the College are handled by Savitribai Phule Pune University International Students Centre. The students are required to submit the necessary documents as per the Government and the University rules, as applicable.

### Admission Guidelines

- Parents/Students are requested to go through the Prospectus, College Website, admission guidelines and notices put up on the College notice board, before seeking admission to the College. The admission process follows the rules laid down by the University, the Government of Maharashtra and the management of the ME Society. The rules are also subject to revision from time to time.
- The Principal of the College reserves the right to amend/modify the admission guidelines as per the notifications received from the University, the Government or the Management. Such amendments/modifications will be displayed on the College notice board as and when they become applicable. The Principal also reserves the right to refuse the admission in certain cases if it is likely to jeopardize the overall discipline of the College.
- Students are expected to follow the admissions schedule as notified by the College. It will be the responsibility of the students to provide all the necessary documents as per Government/University rules, failing which, the admission is liable to be cancelled.
- Prospectus/Forms will be issued and accepted as per the schedule displayed on the College notice board. Selected Students list will be put on the College notice board as per the indicated schedule.

Note : The admission form has to be filled online and the hard copy of the form has to be submitted at the time of admission.

### Following documents are to be submitted along with the application form, duly filled in

- 1) True Copy of HSC or equivalent examination mark sheet.
- 2) Original School/College Leaving Certificate.
- 3) True Copy of Caste Certificate and Validity Certificate issued by a competent authority.
- 4) Domicile Certificate of the student, if applicable.
- 5) True Copy of certificate of participation in Sports, Cultural activities, countersigned by the DSO.
- 6) True Copy of the certificate indicating special categories such as freedom fighters, Government employees on transfer, Ex-servicemen, differently abled students etc.
- 7) One stamp size photograph, affixed on the application form. Parent/Students are requested to fill in the admission form legibly, clearly indicating the category of reservation e.g. caste, differently abled student, freedom fighter etc. which they belong to, in the appropriate block provided in the form. In case the information is not applicable, then the word NA should be mentioned in the form. For any clarification, parents/students may contact the designated staff, who is available for help and guidance at the time of admission.
- 8) All admissions are provisional, until confirmed by the appropriate authorities.



### Notice Relating to Fees

The fees are for an academic year. In case of any change in the fees, the same will be notified as and when information is received from the University/Government.

Students/parents are requested to go through the refund of fees chart put up on the notice board in the office, in case of change.

### Rules Regarding Refund of Fees

For the candidate who cancel their admissions before starting the courses for the relevant academic year, entire fee after deduction of processing fee of not more than Rs. 1000/- shall be refunded to the student.

If a student cancels the admission after the commencement of the course, following scheme will be adopted for the refund of total fees:

Sr. No	Time of cancellation	Amount to be Deducted by the College
1.	From 1st day to 10 days (First day is inclusive) from the date of commencement of the course	20% of the fees
2.	From the 11th day to 30th day (First day is inclusive) from the date of commencement of the course	40% of the fees
3.	After 30 days (First day is inclusive)	100% of the total fees

### Rules Regarding Refund of Fees

1. The amount of the caution money, library deposit, laboratory deposits, if any, will be refunded when a student leaves the college or cancels the admission.

Deposit not claimed within one year of leaving the College or cancellation of admission will be forfeited.

2. The amount of deposits will be refunded to the students after the 15 days from the date of receipt of their application duly signed by the student and guardian and NOC from the library.

3. The students who have not surrendered their identity cards and original deposit receipts must surrender the same against the refund of deposits.
